# A Life of Ballet – From Christchurch to Ballet de l'Opera National de Bordeaux France

'There is Always a Way' was the title of Kase Craig's talk to Christchurch South Rotary. This is a saying that he has lived by for many years.



We were very fortunate to have Kase Craig speak to us about his career in ballet to include his current work now that he is no longer involved in professional ballet. He certainly is an inspiration and his talk was high interest.

Kase is a highly accomplished ballet dancer and we felt privileged that he shared his life and experiences with us.

He was brought up in New Brighton where he started tap dancing at the age of five. This was the beginning of a successful career in professional ballet.

After 10 years of competing in ballet competitions in New Zealand and Australia he gained a 1 year scholarship to The Australian Ballet School and later a 3 year scholarship to The New Zealand School of Dance in Wellington. This included academic study in the morning and training in the

afternoon up to 6pm. Kase was recognised as a Distinguished Graduate of the New Zealand School of Dance.

He also earned a contract to dance professionally with the Ballet de L'Opera National de Bordeaux. Kase has also performed at venues in Paris and Venice and toured to countries such as Russia, China and Hong Kong. His expertise has certainly been recognised in many corners of the world. Kase believes that it is necessary to start young to be able to pursue ballet professionally. He also said that he has had many amazing opportunities.

He was trained in Classical Ballet but did start to develop skills in Contemporary Ballet in the later part of his career. He said that he had to step out of the mode that he was trained in.

A documentary by Television New Zealand featured Kase.

Kase retired from performing at 30 years of age but continues to impart his skills and talent, teaching at five dance schools in Christchurch.

In 2020 he completed an MBA (Master of Business Administration) at Canterbury University with core skills in arts leadership. This has enabled him to experience the business and commercial world.

He is now a people consultant at Brannigans. He has been involved in designing a public space for neurodiverse people at The Canterbury Museum. Kase spoke about the analytical mind and the unconscious mind and the ways to problem solve.

He said that creativity is simply applied imagination. Imagination: envision what does not exist; Creativity: a process of having original ideas that have value; Innovation; and Implementation of creative ideas.

Kase said that 'creativity is not about the finished product as we all use creativity in our everyday lives'.
