SPEAKER REPORT 14 MAY 2025

This week our speaker was Jo Dowling, who is also a Rotarian, speaking to us about the Nurse Maude Hospice.



Nurse Maude was born in NZ, and became Head Matron at Christchurch Hospital, following which she started a system of caring for patients in their own homes, where they felt the "at home" comfort. This was the foundation of the first District Nursing service in NZ.

The Nurse Maude philosophy is now well-established in Wellington, Nelson and Blenheim, as well as in the Nurse Maude Christchurch Hospice in Merivale. Nurse Maude supports and empowers people to maintain their independence for as long as possible.

The Nurse Maude Hospice provides palliative care, free to those who need it. Often the key to this is pain management, providing comfort and relieving suffering. Primary palliative care is provided by GPs, Practice Nurses, District Nurses and Aged Residential Care facilities.


Nurse Maude Canterbury covers the area from Kaikoura t Ashburton and also to the West Coast. The Hospice has an inpatient unit with 11 beds, where care and counselling are provided. 70% of the patients have cancer, and 260 volunteers assist with meal service, pastoral care, and helping patients to produce a biography of their life.

In the year to June 2024, the Canterbury Nurse Maude organization dealt with 1,433 patients, including 292 patient admissions, and provided end-of-life care to 645 people.

The current Hospice was not a purpose-built facility, so the organization is looking build a new hospice building which will be well-designed to be more homely with access to gardens. This comes at a time when the numbers of older people are increasing with longer life expectancies. The key focus is to provide support for primary healthcare providers.

The Nurse Maude organization is 70% funded by the Government, but this means a sizable 30% has to be found to keep it afloat, so that they can continue their priority of providing quality care. They also provide hire equipment (wheelchairs, etc.) for their patients

Jo's address gave us an amazing insight into the Nurse Maude organization and the wonderful work they do for the community – thank you, Jo, for sharing this with us.
