Orana Park - the Christchurch treasure that many of us have forgotten about. Tonight's talk by Nathan Hawke, Orana Park's Marketing, Public Relations and Visitor Services Manager, was a reminder to many that it is far too long since we have been to this wonderful zoo on the outskirts of our city.

It is coming up to 50 years since it was started by the South Island Zoological Society In those early days they had a drive through lion reserve and then from 1999 a lion encounter which was unique in the southern hemisphere, although this is not operating at the moment. Currently the zoo is operated by the Orana Park Wildlife Trust which has expanded it to involve 60 staff (48FTEs) and 70 volunteers including our own Andrew Kim. Remarkably, the zoo has about 1000 animals of 70 different species on their 185 hectare site.

A visit to Orana Park is an opportunity to see many animals from Africa, New Zealand, Asia, Australia and America. The Gorillas are particularly special, being the only ones in New Zealand since 2016. The Tasmanian Devil is the only one to be found outside Australia. It's important to remember that running a zoo is much more than looking after some special animals. Many of them are threatened species so Orana Park is involved with other zoos around in the world in breeding programmes aimed at preservation and maintaining genetic diversity. This is time consuming and expensive.

The zoo has an extensive native fauna collection and is inevitably involved with organisations such as the Department of Conservation in programmes aimed at preserving some of our endangered species. They have a breeding programme for brown kiwi and are also involved in conservation programmes for South Island whio (blue duck), pāteke (brown teal), orange-fronted parakeet/kākāriki karaka and Maud Island frogs. 10 staff are dedicated to this work.

It is well known that interaction with animals helps to break down barriers and build confidence. Being able to hand feed animals such as the giraffes and pet animals in the farmyard are therefore important aspects of the zoo visitor's experience. Groups often visit the zoo specifically to give their members the benefit of this experience. The Orana Park staff also run formal education programmes which line up with the school curriculum from new entrants right through to year 13.

So what about the future? A new programme involves exploring the "non-public" part of the zoo site to identify the biodiversity that naturally exists there and making it a habitat in its own right. However, all of this costs – about \$100,000 per week! Prior to 2015, about 95% of the required income came from gate takings from the 160,000 to 200,000 annual visitors, but increased costs have reduced that to about 65%. The Park is hopeful the current deliberations on the Christchurch City Council Annual Plan with result in some financial assistance from that source. We can help by making a submission of we're so inclined, but beyond that it behoves us all to visit the zoo and enjoy the experience that is sitting there waiting!
