Tonight our Guest Speaker was Aspiring Leaders attendee Alessandra Ward.

Introduced to the Club by David Buist Alessandra gave an insightful talk on her 3 days in Wellington as organised by NZ Leaders Trust.

The Aspiring Leaders' Forum on faith and values is an annual event that brings together a diverse group of committed young leaders from across New Zealand.

Guided by facilitators and national leaders, selected young people discuss leadership from a narrative point of view throughout a carefully planned and varied three day programme.

With around 100 in attendance groups of 8 or 9 are formed.

A trip to Parliament produced a photo opportunity on the steps of Parliament House. This was followed by sitting in on Question Time. At this point Alessandra had her eyes opened to the spirited interactions of the nations leaders. Enough said perhaps. A highlight was meeting Governor General Dame Cindy Kiro.

Alessandra enjoyed a day of volunteering for community work. Coming from a farming family she found pitching in came naturally to her. Tree planting in a reserve was an experience she enjoyed. "Service is important to me. My goal is to deliver through service".

Speakers at the Forum included John Elliot formerly with McDonalds Corporation. A quote that he left his audience thinking about was "A desk is a dangerous place from which to view the world".

A highlight for another attendee was hearing Rt Hon Jim Bolger speak and being inspired by his experiences as a former Prime Minister. After his talk, she felt empowered, realising that she was already equipped to be a catalyst for change. "I can have an impact and bring restoration" was this young persons conclusion.

It is six months since Alessandra attended the Aspiring Leaders Forum

but it has taken at least part of that time for her to absorb and appreciate all the various aspects of what she learnt in her time in Wellington. Being nominated by her peers from RYLA to attend was in itself an honour she explained.
