Toi Otautahi – bringing together the city's creative stories

Moemoea Vision:

'to be known as New Zealand's best place to live and create, where the arts activate Otautahi Christchurch and creative exploration defines who we are'.

MOEMOEĀ VISION TO BE KNOWN AS NEW ZEALAND'S BEST PLACE TO LIVE AND CREATE, WHERE THE ARTS ACTIVATE OTAUTAHI CHRISTCHURCH AND CREATIVE EXPLORATION DEFINES WHO WE ARE.

Jamie Hanton is one of the Community Arts Advisors for the Christchurch City Council, who helps implement the Toi Otautahi Arts Strategy for the city.

He started as a writer reporting about artist's life and work.



Jamie, now an employee of the CCC, looks after the arts and wellbeing spaces and is involved in the Te Ora Auaha network. He takes a lead in looking after artists in community residences and commissions art work for the city.

He co-leads Summer Theatre something that many of us have enjoyed in Hagley Park. He said that he is bringing creativity into everyday lives.

In 2005 Jamie started Gallery Quentin Frost in High Street a space for emerging artists. His work has taken him to Venice to organise the New Zealand Pavilion and to Taipei a sponsored trip through Creative New Zealand.

Supporting the arts to include artist's health and wellbeing is the main part of his work. Creative professionals are still earning considerably less than other New Zealand wage earners with a median income of \$37000. Creative professionals often have to support their income with other work. Jamie said that due to the low demand for their services, artist's chances of getting work was low.

Strategies for Arts and Creativity have been developed.

They are:

- Over 200 individuals and organisations attended workshops across the city and provided written submissions during the first phase of engagement in 2018.
- An overriding theme of the consultation was a collaboration, with a sense of what could be achieved together following the 2010 2011 earthquakes.
- What emerged was a new kind of partnership strategy, co-created and to be co-owned with the arts sector and major funding agencies, including: Creative New Zealand, Christchurch NZ, Rata Foundation and Mana Whenua.

Jamie spoke about Capability Development: where there are opportunities for art, music and dance workshops; Resourcing: where spaces for work are made available as well as Access and Awareness of all the Arts.

There is Public Funding for the Arts through the Ministry of Culture and Heritage, New Zealand Lotteries Commission, Creative New Zealand and Local Government. Jamie and other Art Advisors provide specific and general funding advice across a number of fund providers to strengthening communities and enable events and festivals to take place.

Many new spaces are being developed in Christchurch. The Museum is undergoing a revamp and will open in about 3 years time. The new Court Theatre on the corner of Colombo and Gloucester Street is due to open on 3 May 2025. Many new spaces have been or are being developed for stories.

Thank you Jamie for your very informative talk and for your work making Christchurch a city where creative stories are being brought together.


