Christchurch Kidney Society – Making a difference in Canterbury

Jo Houghton the Manager of The Christchurch Kidney Society gave a very informative talk about the Society and its work. The aims of the Society are to offer assistance to people with renal failure, provide equipment for the relief, rehabilitation and comfort of patients, foster public awareness in the causes of renal disease and research.

The Christchurch Kidney Society has been serving the community for 47 years and was formerly known as the New Zealand Dialysis and Transplant Society Inc. 1977 – 1985. It was started by patients and doctors.

Jo outlined what the society does to include: care packs for dialysis and transplant patients, organizing social events, Youth support through the Graeme Cox Youth Education Trust, offering information, membership, newsletters and gift packs and having available a mobile dialysis campervan. The campervan is hired about 10 times a year and is fitted out with a dialysis machine. This allows patients to have a holiday that otherwise would not be possible. Since 1978 the Society have had three campervans and are planning to have a replacement 2024 / 2025.

Jo spoke about dialysis. If kidney function is between 7-10% dialysis may bring the function up to 15%. A very sad statistic as patients spend many hours using a dialysis machine. Healthy kidneys remove fluid and waste from your blood but let proteins and other important nutrients pass through and return to your blood.

There are various warning signs of Kidney and Urinary Tract Disease.

They are: discomfort of burning while passing urine, more frequency or poor bladder control, blood in the urine, swelling of the ankles, backpain below the ribs and nearby areas, and high blood pressure.

Jo said that Kidney Disease is a silent killer so knowing the signs is important as well as asking your Doctor for a simple kidney test. There is a need to be aware of your blood pressure as 80% of people with kidney disease have high blood pressure.
