Eric Livingstone spoke about

Rewi Alley 1897-1987

An Extraordinary Ordinary New Zealander?

We were very fortunate to have Eric Livingstone talk to us about Rewi Alley's life. I have to admit that I had heard the name but knew nothing of the man himself. Thanks to Eric's detailed talk we are all now very informed.

Rewi was born in Springfield and attended Christchurch Boys High. He died at the age of 90 in Beijing, China.

He served overseas during WW1. Rewi returned to New Zealand for a short while before heading to China to work as a fire officer, factory inspector, relief worker and laboured among the Chinese trying to improve their working conditions. The work listed exposed him to poverty in the Chinese community. During the Japanese invasion of China in 1937, he became involved in Chinese Industrial Cooperatives, known as 'Gung Ho/Work Together,' to create employment. Rewi was also involved in setting up schools in various parts of the country.

For the League of Nations National Flood Relief Commission, Rewi Alley arranged for camps up and down the rivers, becoming very involved in flood and famine work. He potentially saved 300000 refugees from the flooded city of Wuhan.

It has been stated that Rewi 'was a remarkable man and his work is beyond praise'.

Rewi was a prolific writer and a member of the Communist party.

Both New Zealand and Chinese Governments have honoured Rewi and his work. There are over 40 monuments and memorials to Rewi in China ranging from schools, statues, busts, roads, libraries, hotels, museums, parks, squares and memorials. A house he stayed in has been kept as a memorial and now part of it is a museum. It has been renovated and contains a permanent exhibition of Rewi and his work. He stayed and worked in China for 60 years becoming one of China's best-known and best-loved foreigners.

Eric noted the influences on Rewi's life to include: his parents and upbringing, his deep religious beliefs, home and school education, country life in Amberley and Southland, high school and sports,

war service, military medal and war wounds, witnessing the plight of the ordinary Chinese people, flooding and famine devastation and his amazing success of helping huge numbers of people.

I will conclude by adding some quotes that Eric shared with us:

'You are NZ's greatest son,' NZPM David Lange.


'I have met a Saint,' visiting British Bishop.
