Retired Christchurch Family Court Judge Mr Rob Murfitt

Rob was originally from the North Island and practised as a solicitor in Taranaki for many years covering a mixture of criminal and more recently family court matters. He was approached to join the Family Court and was formally appointed by Margaret Wilson, the Attorney General at the time.

Rob acknowledged the Family Court had a very big work load, which has been steadily increasing in recent years, which put increasing pressure on facilities and staff. We note a story in December 2016 when it was noted that Rob Murfitt as a Christchurch Family Court Judge slammed the Government over a "breach of the UN convention". The comments came after the Judge was forced to keep a 15 year old boy in solitary confinement because of a lack of facilities. In fact, the boy spent 6 days in solitary confinement in Christchurch because there was nowhere else he could be remanded in custody. The Judge noted that a wing of Christchurch Youth Justice facility had been mothballed by the Government. His criticisms were also echoed by Judge Andrew Becroft, the Nation's Children's Commissioner.

Rob also recounted a case where he had to consider a defendant who was about to join the army but was before the Judge for a misdemeanour – that he did not qualify. Rob offered him the opportunity to run an errand and be back at the Court House before close of business, at which time he saw fit to discharge the defendant without conviction. From all accounts, his approach as a Family Court Judge demonstrated a very human approach, sadly often lacking in other jurisdictions.

Amongst other responsibilities, he was Chairman of the organisation known as "One Mother To Another" and, whilst he retired as Chairman last year, he still remains a Trustee.

Rob has kept his sanity under the high work load in the Family Court by writing children's books under the name of Robert James. In fact, he handed out examples of those books at our meeting and a number of our members saw fit to purchase them at the meeting.

In summary, his address was of a high quality and, as noted, he demonstrated a capacity for compassion in his role as a local Family Court Judge. We can only commend him for his efforts in the Family Court arena.



Hydrotherapy Pool at the new Matatiki: Hornby Centre in Kyle Park

The Rotary Club of Hornby and the Greater Hornby Residents Association have joined together in a major campaign to fundraise for the Hydrotherapy Pool at the new Matatiki: Hornby Centre in Kyle Park. The Council has included the Hydrotherapy Pool in this development, with the expectation that the community provides \$1.4million towards the cost. This is fantastic to see how embedded Rotary clubs are in their local communities.

Hydrotherapy is a recognised physical and mental health treatment as the water pressure and movement as a form of physiotherapy for body and joint pain. This relieves symptoms of many things such as arthritis, osteoporosis, cerebral palsy, and recovery from accidents and sporting injuries. The pool would be accessible to anyone in our community, and will provide a great service to those in the community with disabilities, health conditions or physical rehabilitation.

As part of fundraising efforts, a Splash for Cash event is to be held on Friday 10 November and the aim is to get the community fundraising for the pool.

The club may consider purchasing a table or a couple of seats at the event to come along for a great night (email Kim to arrange a purchase). Another way you may wish to consider supporting our fundraising efforts is the purchase of a "Bubble". The CCC has kindly given us a wall to place our bubbles which can have your name or logo. There are three options of sizes based on donations of \$250, \$500 and \$1000.
